INTERNSHIPS, PLACEMENTS AND CAREER PREPARATION

We aim to create work-ready graduates to prepare you for a seamless entry into the workforce. Our curriculum is developed in consultation with industry, with many programs accredited by professional bodies in Australia and overseas. We offer a perfect balance of theoretical and practical learning experiences with clinical and industrial placements for programs such as engineering and nursing, and unique 10-week internships in selected business and information technology programs. We also offer career orientated services such as CQUni Careers which provides career education, guidance and information. Our newly developed Career Connection is a mentoring program connecting our alumni to current students to assist with career preparation.

DISTANCE EDUCATION

We offer a wide range of programs by distance education, so you can earn an internationally recognised qualification whilst continuing with your current lifestyle and/or work commitments in your home country. You will study the same course content and access the same support services as our on-campus students. Distance education provides you with the added flexibility to study part-time or full-time and the potential to save on costs.

PATHWAYS AND RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING (RPL)

Regardless of your educational background or where you are in life, we have an entry pathway that is suitable for you. If you have previously studied relevant courses at another institution, you may be eligible for RPL, also known as credit exemption, advanced standing or credit transfer. If your application for RPL is approved, it will reduce the number of courses you need to undertake to complete your program.

CQUGlobal Inbound programs

If you are studying at an overseas institution, you can study part of your award with us for a few weeks, one term or a full academic year and transfer study credits back to your home institution. This is a perfect opportunity to experience our range of exciting programs, vibrant campus locations, and what Australia has to offer. CQUGlobal Outbound programs

CQUNIVERSITY GLADSTONE CITY AND GLADSTONE MARINA

The Gladstone area is a region of diversity – tourism, community and industry co-exist in harmony, retaining an agreeable lifestyle and environment balance. We have two campuses in Gladstone. The picturesque Gladstone Marina campus is located next to the harbour and houses the University's Engineering and Environment Management Complex dedicated to engineering research and training. The campus environment provides a unique platform for learning and research, with modern buildings and spacious grounds.



CQUNIVERSITY BUNDABERG

Bundaberg is located in the agricultural belt of Queensland, making it an ideal campus to study agribusiness and horticulture. It is the only campus which offers programs in aviation. We have world-leading experts delivering programs from bachelor to masters levels. The campus is situated on large grounds with clinical nursing and scientific laboratories, multimedia and sound studios, and boasts interactive electronically transmitted lectures to integrate with other campuses.



CQUNIVERSITY BRISBANE

Mackay is a relaxed tropical city with near perfect weather all year round. Our resort-style Mackay Ooralea campus offers modern facilities for nursing, engineering and the trades, and the internationally-regarded Central Queensland Conservatorium of Music. 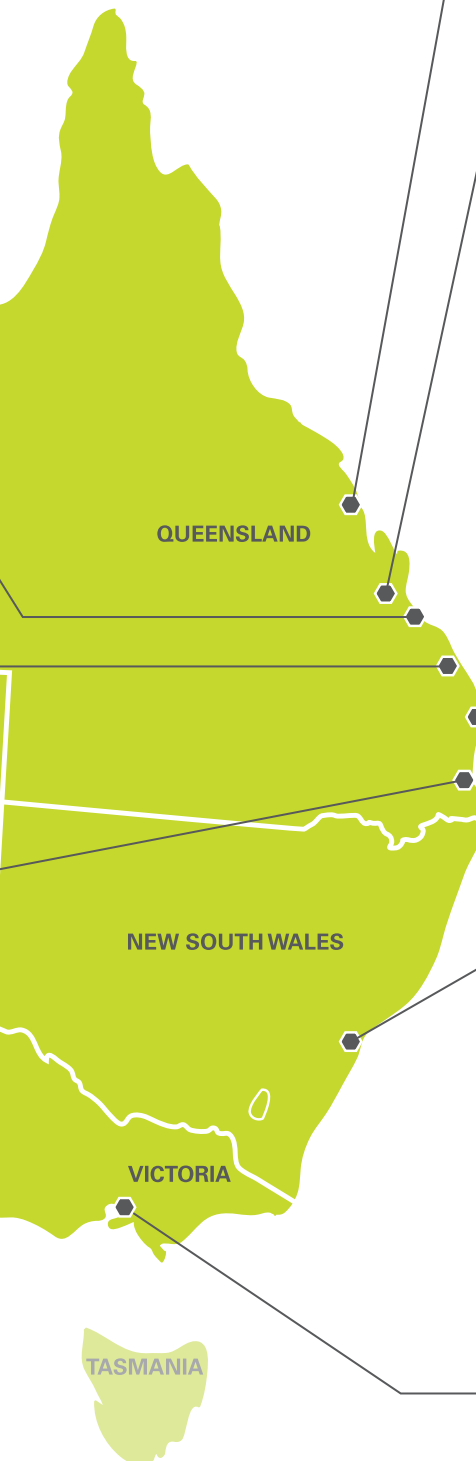


CQUNIVERSITY MELBOURNE

This two-term program is also ideal for students who have not completed the equivalent of 12 years of schooling in their home country.

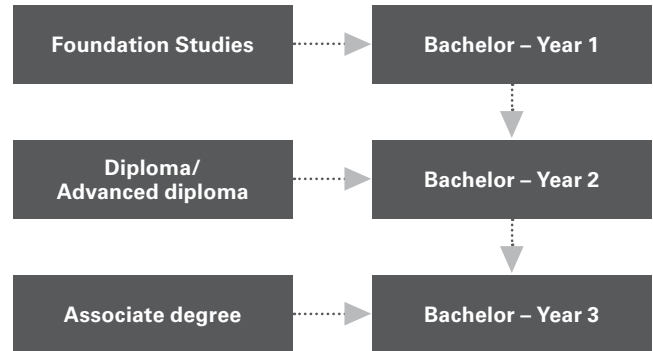
OPTION 3: CERTIFICATE/DIPLOMA PATHWAY

You can complete a CQUniversity certificate or diploma to gain entry to the first or second year of your relevant undergraduate degree. This pathway also gives you a standalone qualification. Alternatively, if you already hold an Australian diploma or its equivalent, you may gain entry to the first or second year (with advanced standing) of a wide variety of undergraduate degrees.

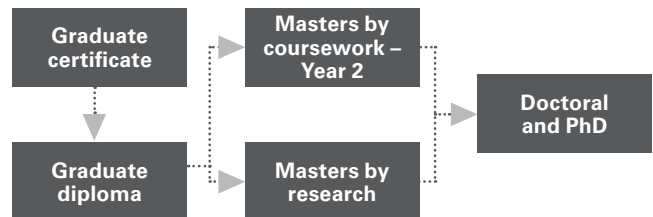
PATHWAY ROAD MAP

- » Not all courses in a program are available in every term.
- » Duration specified is based on a study mode of two terms per annum.
- » International students can only undertake programs by distance education from an overseas location.
- » Programs undertaken by distance education may be studied on a full-time or part-time mode.
- » Estimated term fees for programs that are available by distance education are based on a standard full-time study mode, except for CC63, CC65 and CC78, which are only available on a part-time basis.
- » International students studying on-campus in Australia may only take 25 percent of their entire program by distance education, and this option cannot be taken in its entirety during a compulsory term (Term 1 and Term 2).
- » It is your responsibility to make yourself aware of the entry requirements and pre-requisites of the program you wish to undertake. You should consult with a CQUniversity adviser prior to applying.
